In your hands you are holding the sixth annual catalogue introducing the up-and-coming generation of European documentary film producers – the Emerging Producers. The present edition has just crossed the magic line of one hundred selected producers, who are certain to have a substantial influence on the future of creative documentary cinema not only in Europe. After five years of the project's existence, we have now decided to expand its scope: the programme held as part of the Ji.hlava IDFF will be followed with a second part organized in the second half of February in Berlin.

The project started off in 2012, fast attracting interest and earning respect of film professionals, as it points out how complex and underestimated the role of film producers is today. At the same time, owing to the very careful selection of the participants, it became the key that helps navigate distribution. We need creative personalities the waters of film production while digitisation further multiplies the quantity of the developed and distributed films.

Last but not least, the Emerging Producers project provides a generational platform. In the field of arts, like, for instance, in geography, each epoch can be clearly identified: stones - like films and works of fine arts – indicate the framing of a specific time period. And the project's generational character makes this layer legible, intensifies the international impact of the create films and adds layers to their content. It also fosters intergenerational exchange, regardless of how different can authorial and production approaches be.

The audiovisual landscape is changing. The traditional ways by which we used to develop, produce and consume content are vanishing. As a result, innovation and creativity have become the key words of today. They drive the changes we are witnessing, and at the same time they are our only means for navigating our way through them. The European Union's Creative Europe programme believes in innovation and creativity. Innovation is at the core of the Creative Europe's funding for support, content development, distribution, promotion and professional training.

Emerging Producers was created by the Ji.hlava IDFF in order to address producers as individuals engaged in the process of creating works of art. But with the profound changes we are witnessing, we need creativity not only for art, but also for the business of its financing, production and capable of thinking outside the box, of identifying new possibilities, of working with audiences from the very beginning of a film project, and of marketing and promoting the stories they are trying to tell in a completely different way than producers in the past.

Emerging Producers is a great place for fostering such individuals. The programme does not work with fixed schemes and projects; instead, it allows room for creativity, peer-to-peer sharing and learning. I am thus glad that Creative Europe Desk Czech Republic – MEDIA has been invited to support project, now in Ji.hlava for the sixth year in a row.





fig. 3. Under the Frog by Tibor Fischer





fig. 3. Hidden Life of Trees by Peter Wohlleben






fig. 3. Atlas







fig. 3. Moon Palace by Paul Auste





fig. 3. Great Expectations by Charles Dickens

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







fig. 2. Josef Hader






fig. 3. The Price of Salt by Claire Morgan






fig. 3. Milenijum u Beogradu by Vladimir Pistalo
