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EMERGING PRODUCERS IN THE YEAR OF CORONA

For the majority of cinemas around the world, 2020 has meant having to temporarily shut down or significantly reduce their seating capacity. As a result, a number of multiplex chains have entered into an economic coma, and the first of them have already begun announcing that they've filed for bankruptcy. Many major Hollywood film studios—whose productions have dominated cinemas all over the world for years—have been forced to suspend their investments until things get better or have been actively testing out the distribution of new releases through their own VOD distribution.

All of this has had a major impact on viewer behaviour, even in countries where cinemas remained open or are open right now. A window of opportunity has presented itself to us and could spark change in viewer habits. It's up to us whether cinemas will maintain their sovereign position amidst the onslaught of digital alternatives or whether we can take advantage of the situation and witness a renaissance in European film. In a similar fashion, shifting to online distribution and combining cinematography with a VR and XR environment can offer innovative new possibilities for artistic expression. After all, only a few decades separated Michelangelo Antonioni from film fairground screenings during the beginning of cinema. We are at a point where anything can happen.

During the first few months of this year, when we were organising a series of interviews with producers enrolled in the Emerging Producers programme, it was interesting to see how the coronavirus pandemic had found its way into their work in various different ways. While some adapted their ongoing filming and principal photography process to be more COVID-secure, others used the extra time they gained to focus more on planning out new projects and concluding grant applications. Some of the first-ever online festivals took place while industry

programmes and workshops also shifted towards an online environment. Skype has quickly replaced new services that most of us have never even heard of before. Upcoming feature-length projects were largely suspended because no one at the time knew-and probably still don't even know-how the pandemic will transform human behavior.


But it's already quite certain today that the pandemic will fundamentally change the film world. For feature films, it might mean the return of imagination and surprise while the documentary sphere will become more digitally connected, making it far more interactive. Shooting a film and easily sharing it to the public will become a natural form of expression for everyone. Does the umpteenth new wave of flawless historical, fantasy, and sci-fi films await us? With all the current possibilities at our disposal, there are a number of different ways we can go.

For its ninth outing, the Emerging Producers programme will once again present a selection of emerging talents from a new generation of European producers. With their vision, energy, and dedication to the world of cinema, they are likely the ones that will shape the future of film. It would be a shame to once again fall second to American film studios. So let's be second to none and get European audiences back into European films! Together we can give rise to films from around the world that never cease to amaze audiences and make them think.




fig. 3. The Magus by John Fowles






fig. 3. Foucault's Pendulum by Umberto Eco

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


fig. 2. Hiroshi Sugimoto





fig. 3. Post Office by Charles Bukowski






fig. 3. Dona Flor and Her Two Husbands by Jorge Amado




fig. 5. Diary


fig. 4. List of films






fig. 3. The Catcher in the Rye by J. D. Salinger






fig. 3. The Time Regulation Institute by Ahmet Hamdi Tanpınar






fig. 3. Pantaleon and the Visitors by Mario Vargas Llosa
