



fig. 2. Amedeo Modigliani

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




fig. 2. Letizia Battagli





fig. 3. Conquest of the Useless by Werner Herzog





fig. 3. Normal People by Sally Rooney






fig. 3. Roadside Picnic by Arkady Strugatsky and Boris Strugatsky






fig. 3. Three Comrades by Erich Maria Remarque






fig. 2. Vincent van Gogh





fig. 3. 4321 by Paul Auster




fig. 3. The Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini






fig. 2. Henning Mank




fig. 3. The Slap by Christos Tsiolkas




fig. 2. Mieke Bal




fig. 3. Mrs. Dalloway by Virginia Woolf







fig. 3. Momo by Michael Ende
